

## **Part I – What is Self-Service?**

Self-Service is the User Interface (UI) that pulls data from Colleague and makes it available to users.

It's not "something new." It's just a new tool for accessing information by the campus community.

### Self-Service is not...

- 1. Magic
- 2. A mind-reader
- 3. One-stop shop for anything and everything we may want to access







## **Colleague-BSC's Operating Backbone**

**Colleague** is the Enterprise Resource Planning (ERP) software that BSC uses to manage day-to-day business activities.

- Student information
- Registrar services (transcripts, registration, academic programs)
- Financial Aid
- Student Accounts
- Human Resources
- Academic Advising (Degree Audit: Student Planning and Progress)

## Colleague

All functions in Colleague require security clearance.

*Self-Service* allows a more general access to information that is necessary for academic advising, registration, and general student academic information.

## Why does this matter?

In a general sense, understanding the relationship between Colleague and Self-Service is key in understanding what is available to the user in Self-Service and limitations to access of information.

The more pertinent reason for understanding how Colleague and Self-Service relate in this presentation is to respond to a common "comment/complaint" from students and faculty...

## "Self-Service *Progress* is wrong."



## Self-Service *Progress*

- Pulls 100% from Colleague Program Requirements (REQU)
- Colleague Program Requirements are taken directly from the BSC Catalog.
- Student Catalog of Entry (First term at BSC) is the "default" Catalog year for their Academic Program which includes *Explorations* and the major, minor, or other programs.
- Colleague does not read minds. Students must keep their academic programs updated with Academic Records.


For training purposes, we are going to look at the B.S. in Psychology.

## **B.S. in Psychology**

Colleague holds three versions of the Psychology major requirements (REQU):

The following courses are required (12 units): PY 101 PY 221 PY 222 PY 301 PY 312 three units from the following: PY 211 PY 224 PY 313 PY 370 PY 372 three elective units in PY one unit in PY 410 or 450, or 2 units of PY E499 or PY 470 followed by PY 472; PY 472 will count as one of the three elective psychology units

Bachelor of Science

Majors should take PY 221 and PY 222 consecutively and are strongly encouraged to complete them by the end of the sophomore year. All majors will complete a comprehensive assessment in psychology as part of the senior seminar.

# Self-Service *Progress* pulls the REQU for the major by Catalog Year

When a department changes major requirements, all current declared majors are not automatically "migrated" to the new requirements. Faculty cannot "verbally" tell majors that they are on track to graduate if they just take the new courses.

Current majors are still associated with the major requirements in their Catalog year in Colleague.

# What are options when major requirements change?

- 1. A teach-out plan for current majors providing needed courses to fulfill the requirements in their Catalog. If only course numbers are changed, this generally won't have an adverse affect on students.
- 2. Keep track of all majors who are affected by the change in requirements. Make a plan for them to complete requirements through "Exceptions and Overrides" (EXOV). The Degree Audit Specialist has to manually apply the exceptions to each student's academic program. This is a multi-step process and is very time consuming when large numbers of students are affected.
- 3. Official communication with Academic Records to change the student's Catalog year. This will apply the new major requirements.

# If course numbers change, that should automatically update in Colleague.

Academic Records *equates* the course in Colleague so *Self-Service* should pull the new course into a requirement.

## **Important note on item number 3**:

EVERY major is also LINKED to *Explorations:*

3. Official communication with Academic Records to change the student's Catalog year. This will apply the new major requirements.

This works only if *Explorations* requirements are the same as stated in the student's Catalog.

\*\*If General Education requirements change with a Catalog, then the student MUST adopt the NEW general education requirements in order to follow the NEW major requirements. It is NOT possible to Mix and Match General Education and majors from different Catalog years.

# This student is under Catalog 19-20 so the major requirements are still reflecting the 19-20 requirements on *Progress.* It will look "wrong."

Colleague is the backbone of all day-to-day operations at BSC.


Self-Service *Student Planning* and *Progress* pull directly from Colleague program requirements.
